





#### **OUR PROGRAMS:**

2020 was a year with extreme challenges, especially for neighbors who were already struggling. When the COVID-19 shutdown began in March, Reconciliation Services was deemed essential by the Kansas City Mayor's office. We never shut down and we continued serving our neighbors with the health of our staff and clients as a top priority. YOU helped us keep caring for those in need!

When COVID-19 shut restaurants down across the nation, Thelma's Kitchen, KC's first "Donate-What-You-Can" cafe, stayed true to its mission and served more than 12,000 free meals to our neighbors who were hit hardest by the pandemic. By August, the team completely reworked its operations and began serving Thelma's Box Lunch at a newly installed to-go window and delivering to businesses and organizations across the metro who choose to #EatWell and #DoGood by supporting our community with lunch from Thelma's.

### Foster Grandparents PROGRAM

The RS Foster Grandparents Program equips lowincome older adults to provide one-on-one mentoring, tutoring, and emotional support for youth with exceptional needs, while offering the Grandparents a small volunteer stipend. Virtual schooling kept the Grandparents out of the classroom, but it did not stop them from serving their students or taking care of themselves and one another through letter writing, regular virtual meetings, and technology trainings.

## R.E.V.E.A.L. PROGRAM

The REVEAL Program [Restore-Engage-Value-Encourage-Act-Lead] promotes hope and healing through comprehensive social and mental health services, including: ID/Document assistance; housing/utilities support; Medicine Cabinet assistance; case management; and individual and group trauma and depression therapy -- advocating for our most vulnerable neighbors to help move them from emergency to greater self-sufficiency. Stringent safety protocols and social distancing enabled us to continue serving many of our neighbors in person. We also began offering tele-health and tele-case management to better serve our neighbors.



In 2020 we launched The Social Leader Essentials E-course to train professionals in Kansas City and across the country on the transformational power of social venturing, how to increase effectiveness by becoming bias aware, and how to grow in compassion through traumainformed leadership. The accompanying Social Leader podcast featured nationally-renowned guests sharing their diverse leadership lessons.
